CHALLENGE GRADUATE SURVEYS

Approximately three months after your ChalleNGe cadet graduates, they will be invited to take a series of surveys about their activities and life since graduating from Mountaineer ChalleNGe Academy-North. These surveys are aimed at learning more about how ChalleNGe helps improve the lives of graduates and to provide leadership with evidence to continually improve the ChalleNGe program.

More detailed information will be sent with subsequent newsletters. All surveys are voluntary and confidential and will take between 5-15 minutes to complete.



SERVICE TO COMMUNITY

During weeks 3-21 of the Residential Phase, the Cadets receive instruction centered around the 8 Core Components. One of these Core Components is Service to Community. Cadets develop an understanding of the benefits to be gained through volunteerism in community service projects and agencies. Cadets volunteer many hours during the program performing services for organizations such as the American Red Cross Blood Drive, Food for Preston, Burlington Apple Butter Festival, Kingwood and Reedsville VFD, Operation Gratitude, Rowlesburg Park, and Trout for Cheat to name a few. 100% of the Cadets participate in the work and service projects, which will develop and improve work habits, work skills, and sense of community involvement. Each Cadet is required to perform 40 hours of Service to Community. Certificates of Appreciation and Letters of Recommendation are presented to Cadets from the recipients at final graduation as part of the Cadet's portfolio.
